1) God does not tempt us to ______. James 1:13 – 15: ¹³ When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does he tempt anyone; ¹⁴ but each person is tempted when they are dragged away by their own evil desire and enticed. ¹⁵ Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full-grown, gives birth to death.

2) The word "temptation" here can mean both a temptation to sin, and tests and trials. It seems to mean "any kind of ______, or circumstance, that may lead you to sin.

3) "Evil" is probably a noun and can mean "the evil ______" or "the evil thing".

So, broadly speaking, this is prayer for ______ from anything that would cause us to lose our faith. (Rom. 12:21: Be not overcome with evil.)

EPH. 6:10-18 HELPS US:
