I. PRAISE FOR WHAT HE _____

v. 1 – highly exalted – KJV – “He has triumphed gloriously!”

In v. 2 The KJV adds “I will prepare Him a habitation” (Ps. 22:3 “He inhabits the praise of His people”.)

v. 2 – My God AND My father’s God. It’s not enough for God to be your father’s God – He must be _____ God.

My father’s God - God’s history/track record through the generations. The Name he uses here is El/Elohim – the _____ of God.

Warrior v. 3 – “man of war” – The Name “Lord” is Jehovah – the _____ God. Ex. 14:14; II Chron. 20:15 – “the battle is not yours, but God’s!”

V. 6, 12 - Right hand – it represents skill and _____

v. 2: **Strength** - “The Lord _____ my strength”!

Phil. 4:13 – “I can do all things through Christ Who strengthens me” – it’s present tense – “keeps on pouring _____ into me!”
